

Activity Macroplastics: a threat to wildlife

Biology - Module 1

1. Activity - The Ocean Cleanup Debate

In this activity, students will be asked to critically evaluate a proposed solution to ocean macroplastic pollution — the Ocean Cleanup. This is a non-profit organization that aims to rid the world's oceans of 90% of floating plastic pollution through advanced technology. Despite its ambitious goals, the project has faced a variety of criticism, most prominently for failing to target the source of the ocean plastic pollution problem. In this activity, students will evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of the Ocean Cleanup and make arguments in favor or against it.

The activity will take on a debate-style format. The students will be divided into two groups — one in favor of the Ocean Cleanup, and the other against it. Each group will be provided with a worksheet to help it prepare its arguments. There is also a list of online resources the students can use as a starting point for their research. The worksheets and list of resources can be found in the separate PowerPoint for the activity.

Students should be encouraged to include arguments that focus on wildlife and apply the concepts from the first module class, but they do not need to limit their arguments to these topics.

This is a proposed structure for the activity:

- 5 minutes introduction of activity, division into groups
- 15 minutes each group prepares its opening statement
- 6 minutes opening statements (3 minutes per group)
- 8 minutes each group prepares its rebuttal
- 4 minutes rebuttals (2 minutes per group)
- 5-7 minutes closing remarks

2. Worksheets

This is the worksheet each group will use to prepare its argument (here, it is just included as an example, but students should have access to a different powerpoint where these slides can be edited directly).
